
5.IEC - Information, Education and Communication:



Briefly, she described about M-Power strategy and ToFEI guidelines. The importance of community participation and advocacy for successfully controlling tobacco usage were also highlighted. Additionally, the seminar emphasized networking with policymakers to encourage cooperative efforts to improve NTCP.





The Core Committee for Tobacco Control in AIIMS Bhubaneswar organized a symposium at the main auditorium in AIIMS Bhubaneswar. Dr Dillip Kumar Parida, the Medical Superintendent gave the opening remarks emphasizing the need to protect children from adverse effects of tobacco. Prof (Dr) Prasanta Raghab Mohapatra, Dean, Academic talked about the newer tobacco products and their ill effects on the youth. He also talked about the role of companies in the marketing of tobacco products for increasing their sales. Prof (Dr) Sonu H Subba, Professor, HOD, and Nodal person for Core Committee for Tobacco Control, AIIMS Bhubaneswar elucidated on this year's theme, 'Protecting children from tobacco industry interference' by giving real-life examples of the tobacco companies' role on increasing their sale among children and youths, specifically by advertisements, social media usage and modifying the tobacco products. She also emphasised avoiding products manufactured by tobacco companies to reduce tobacco use and the preventive

strategies in the form of COTPA act and MPOWER strategy. Dr Prajna Paramita Giri talked about the burden of tobacco use in Odisha, India, and at the global level and how the tobacco epidemic is encroaching on children. Dr. Arpit Jashwantbhai Parmar (Assistant Professor, Department of Psychiatry) talked about the myths related to tobacco addiction and termed it as a disease with an explanation of the biological basis for addiction. A panel discussion was held, moderated by Dr Prajna Paramita Giri, where Prof (Dr) Pradipta Kumar Parida, (HOD, Department of ENT), Prof (Dr) Sourin Bhuniya (HOD, Department of Pulmonary Medicine and Critical Care) Dr Samapika Routray (Additional professor, Department of Dentistry), and Dr Aditi (Assistant professor, Department of Pediatrics) were the panelists. history, weight, height, blood pressure, random blood sugar (RBS), and oral and breast cancer screening were made. The patients who were found to have advanced health issues were counseled, called for follow-up, or referred to the respective departments accordingly.



Tobacco consumption is one of the leading causes of preventable deaths. According to WHO, 8 million deaths occur every year globally because of tobacco consumption. In India, there are almost 267 million tobacco users, who consume tobacco in either smokable or smokeless form.


World no tobacco day (WNTD), an initiation by WHO, is celebrated on 31st May every year globally. This re-emphasizes this global challenge each year and promotes awareness about ill effects of tobacco consumption.

In this regard, a workshop on screening and brief intervention on tobacco use was organized by AIIMS Deoghar, Jharkhand on 07th May 2022 which was the first of several events planned to mark the celebration of WNTD 2022. The objective of the program was to briefly discuss the simple tools and methods of screening and intervention for tobacco dependence. A total of 22 faculty members of AIIMS Deoghar, across the specialties, participated in this workshop.

The workshop commenced with introductory remarks by Prof. Dr. Saurabh Varshney, Executive Director & CEO AIIMS Deoghar. The escalating use of tobacco products, its ill

effects on health, environment and role of healthcare professionals was highlighted. Various aspects of tobacco screening and brief interventions (Motivation to quit, 5 As and 4Rs and pharmacotherapy) were discussed by Dr. Gaurav Jain, Assistant Professor Dept of Dentistry, Dr Santanu Nath, Assistant Professor Dept of Psychiatry and Dr. V L Narsimha, Assistant Professor Dept of Psychiatry. The inaugural address was given by Prof. Dr. Saurabh Varshney, Executive Director & CEO, AIIMS Deoghar. Eminent speakers from WHO and across the country discussed different aspects of tobacco cessation. Dr. Jagdish Kaur, Regional Advisor (TFI), WHO in her keynote address, highlighted the need for tobacco cessation and tobacco as threat to the environment which was also the WHO theme for world no tobacco day 2022. Prof. Pratima Murthy from National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS) explained about "Tobacco Quitline services in the fight against tobacco"; Dr. Dilip Kumar Acharya, President of Indian Medical Association standing committee for cancer prevention and tobacco control emphasized the "Role of health professionals in tobacco cessation"; Dr. Lalit Ranjan Pathak, State Nodal Officer, NCD, Jharkhand, India explained the "Strengthening of National Tobacco Control Program"; Undergraduate students were sensitized on tobacco cessation in early part of their career. Medical officers working under state tobacco control cell in the state of Jharkhand actively participated in the program. Post graduate students, specialists from different branches of medicine took part in the training. The program ended with question-and-answer session, followed by vote of thanks extended by Dr Shubham, Senior resident (Dept of Dentistry). More than 275 people registered for the program and around 100 participants attended the program.
















Figure 15: Online symposium on India fight against tobacco by Prof. Saurabh Varshney, Dr. Jagdish Kaur, Prof. Pratima Murthy, Dr. Lalith Ranjan Pathak, Dr. Dileep Acharya on 31st May 2022










Figure 18: Posters placed in the OPD premises to promote awareness about harms of tobacco use

Activity 1

Poster Competition and Health Awareness Activity

Venue: Baliga Senior Secondary School, Khagaul, Patna

Following a short survey for assessment of awareness and understanding in context of tobacco among students of Standard VII to X at a Government School, an interactive health awareness session was held whereby Faculty from Department of Community and Family Medicine, AIIMS Patna informed the students about the morbidity and mortality due to tobacco consumption, harmful health effects of tobacco and various types of tobacco products available. This was followed by a short talk by Faculty from Department of Psychiatry and CFM on the deception strategies of Tobacco Industry to attract students to the world of tobacco use and the various methods of tobacco cessation. The session saw enthusiastic participation of students and teachers. This was followed by a "No Tobacco Pledge" by students and teachers. A Poster Competition on the topic "Harmful health effects of tobacco" was also held among students and the winners were awarded. A motivational video compiled by Department of Community and Family Medicine titled "Journey of No Tobacco Champions" was shown to the students which comprised of experiences shared by people who have successfully quit tobacco consumption.





Activity 2

No Tobacco Champion Award

Venue: Tobacco Cessation Clinic (TCC), Department of Psychiatry, AIIMS Patna

For the "No Tobacco Champion" Award, based on prior set parameters, a youth was carefully selected among patients who have attended the Tobacco Cessation Clinic (TCC)

located in the Department of Psychiatry, AIIMS Patna and have successfully quit tobacco consumption. He was felicitated for successful quitting of tobacco in the OPD whereby he shared the extent of tobacco consumption earlier along with reasons and his journey of tobacco cessation and motivating factors with the audience that comprised of patients attending OPD and TCC. This was supplemented with motivational talk by Faculty from Dept. of CFM and Psychiatry, about the various psyco-social, economic and personal benefits of not using, and quitting by users of tobacco.





Activity 3

Health Awareness Activity

Venue: Jagat Narayan Lal College, Khagaul, Patna

A team of Faculty and Resident Doctors from AIIMS Patna visited a Government College on the third day whereby following a short survey for assessment of awareness and understanding in context of tobacco among students, a health awareness session was held. Faculty from Department of Community and Family Medicine informed about the morbidity and mortality due to tobacco consumption, harmful health effects of tobacco and various types of tobacco products followed by a talk by Faculty from Department of Psychiatry on the various methods of tobacco cessation. Special focus was made on how youth today are getting trapped by tobacco industry deceptive propaganda. The





motivational video "Journey of No Tobacco Champions" was shown to the students. The event shown enthusiastic participation of students and teachers in attendance along with sharing of experiences.



Activity 4

Health Awareness Activity

Venue: Urban Health Centre, Khagaul

At Urban Health Centre, Khagaul of Department of Community and Family Medicine, AIIMS Patna, a role play by Medical Interns on the harmful health effects of tobacco was organised. This was followed by health awareness talk on harmful effects of tobacco and cessation methods by Faculty and Resident Doctors of the Institution. The audience included patients attending the Centre along with people mobilised from the community residing in nearby areas. A Q & A session was organized looking at the queries of the audience, and myths were addressed and correct information were provided regarding tobacco cessation services.









Activity 5

Pledge Taking Ceremony cum CME

Venue: Auditorium, AIIMS Patna

On the last day, that is, World No Tobacco Day, under the guidance of Executive Director and CEO, AIIMS Patna, a "Pledge Taking Ceremony" was organised by the Department of Community and Family Medicine which was attended by Faculty, Resident Doctors, Medical and Nursing Students and Staff from various cadres of the Institution. Dignitaries included Executive Director, Medical Superintendent, Dean (Academics) and Deputy Director (Administration) of AIIMS Patna. A "No Tobacco Pledge" was administered during the event to restrain from tobacco use, and to make AIIMS Patna a Tobacco Free Campus. Executive


